DINING OUT TABLE TOPPER

Table topper by Nancy Mahoney, using the Downtown fabric collection • Size: 23" x 35 1/2"

YARDAGE

DTWN 241 Z: 1/2 yard of brown framed buildings

DTWN 242 Z: 3/8 yard of brown circles

DTWN 244 KG: 5/8 yard of dark brown texture

Backing: 3/4 yards of any *Downtown* fabric

CUTTING

From the brown framed buildings, cut:

- (8) 6 3/4" x 7 3/4" rectangles, centering a building motif in the middle of each rectangle

From the brown circles, cut:

- (2) 3" x 35 1/2" border strips
- (2) 3" x 18" border strips

From the dark brown texture, cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x 30 1/2" strips
- (5) 1 1/2" x 16" strips
- (4) 1 1/2" x 6 3/4" strips
- (4) 2 1/4" x 42" binding strips

ASSEMBLY

1. Sew a dark brown 1 1/2" x 6 3/4" strips to the top edge of a building rectangle. Sew a second building rectangle to the opposite side of the dark brown strip, making sure to sew the top edge of the rectangle to the strip. Press the seam allowances toward the dark brown strip. Make four.
2. Alternately sew together the four units from step 1 and the dark brown 1 1/2" x 16" strips, beginning and ending with a dark brown strip as shown in the photo. Press the seam allowances toward the dark brown strips.
3. Sew dark brown 1 1/2" x 30 1/2" strips to both long sides of the table topper. Press the seam allowances toward the just-added strips.
4. Sew brown circles 18"-long strips to the short ends of the table topper; press. Then sew the brown circles 35 1/2"-long strips to the long sides of the table topper and press.
5. Layer the table topper with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the dark brown 2 1/4"-wide strips, bind the edges to finish.
