## Cutting

### From the blue floral, cut:

- (7) 7 1/2" x 42" outer-border strips
- (2) 6 1/8" x 42" strips; crosscut into (9) 6 1/8" squares for Block A

### From the cherries-on-ecru, cut:

- (3) 4 7/8" x 42" strips; crosscut into (18) 4 7/8" squares, then cut each square once diagonally to yield (36) triangles for Block A
- (4) 3 7/8" x 42" strips; crosscut into (32) 3 7/8" squares, then cut each square once diagonally to yield (64) triangles for Block B and Block C
- (5) 2 7/8" x 42" strips; crosscut into (54) 2 7/8" squares for Block A
- (6) 1 1/2" x 42" inner-border strips
- (2) 9 3/8" squares; cut each square once diagonally to yield (4) corner triangles

### From the red leaves, cut:

- (5) 2 7/8" x 42" strips; crosscut into (54) 2 7/8" squares for Block A

### From the cherries-on-pink, cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x 42" strips; crosscut into (36) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles for Block A

### From the cherries-on-teal, cut:

- (1) 3 7/8" x 40" strip; crosscut into (8) 3 7/8" squares, then cut each square once diagonally to yield (16) triangles for Block C
- (3) 3 1/2" x 42" strips; crosscut into (24) 3 1/2" squares for Block B and Block C
- (8) 2 1/4" x 40" binding strips
- (6) 1 1/2" x 42" middle-border strips

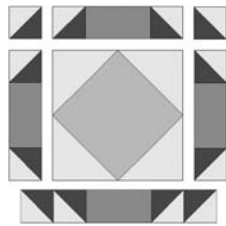
### From the pink floral, cut:

- (2) 9" x 42" strips; crosscut into (4) 9" squares for Block B
- (8) 4 3/4" x 9" rectangles for Block C

# Construction

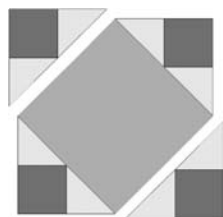
**BLOCK A** (Refer to the diagram following step 6.)

1. Center and sew a  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " cherries-on-ecru triangle to opposite sides of each blue floral square. Press the seams away from the blue square. Sew a cherries-on-ecru triangle to the remaining sides of each blue floral square; press. Make 9 center units.
2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " cherries-on-ecru square. Layer a marked square with a red leaves square, right sides together. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line to yield two half-square-triangle units. Press the seams toward the red. Make 108 units.
3. Sew a half-square-triangle unit to opposite ends of each  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " cherries-on-pink rectangle to make a side unit. Press the seams toward the pink rectangle. Make 36 side units.
4. Sew a side unit from step 3 to opposite sides of each center unit from step 1. Press the seams toward the side units. Make 9.
5. Sew a half-square-triangle unit from step 2 to each end of a remaining side unit from step 3. Press the seams toward the center of the unit. Make 18.
6. Sew a side unit from step 5 to the top and bottom of the unit from step 4 to make a  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " block. Press the seams away from the center. Make 9 of Block A.



**BLOCK B** (Refer to the diagram following step 2.)

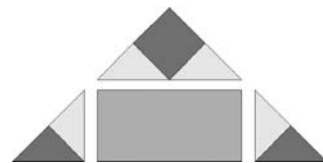
1. Sew two  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " cherries-on-ecru triangles to adjacent sides of each  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " cherries-on-teal square to make a triangle unit. Press the seams toward the ecru triangles. Make 24 units. (You'll have eight units for Block C).
2. Sew a unit from step 1 to opposite sides of each pink floral square; press. Sew a unit to the remaining sides of the pink floral square to make a  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " block. Make 4 of Block B.



## SETTING TRIANGLES

(Refer to the diagram following step 3.)

1. Sew a triangle unit (from step 1 of Block B) to the long edge of each  $4\frac{3}{4}$ " x 9" pink floral rectangle; press. Make 8.
2. Sew a  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " cherries-on-teal triangle to the short side of each cherries-on-ecru triangle to make a larger triangle; press. Sew 8 with the ecru triangle on the right side of the teal triangle and 8 with the ecru triangle on the left side of the teal triangle.
3. Sew a triangle from step 2 to each side of the unit from step 1 to make a setting triangle. Make 8 side-setting triangles.



## QUILT ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING

1. Arrange A and B blocks, the side-setting triangles, and the  $9\frac{3}{8}$ " cherries-on-ecru corner triangles as shown in the photo. Sew the blocks and side-setting triangles in diagonal rows. Press the seams in opposite directions from row to row. Sew the rows together. Press in one direction. Add the corner-setting triangles; press.
2. For the inner-border, sew the  $1\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide cherries-on-ecru strips together to make a long strip. Measure and cut two border strips the exact width of the quilt top. Sew them to the top and bottom of the quilt edges, press seam allowance toward the border. Measure and cut two border strips the exact length of the quilt top, including the just added borders. Sew to the sides of the quilt top; press.
3. For the middle-border, sew the  $1\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide cherries-on-teal strips together to make a long strip. Repeating step 2; measure, cut, and sew the strips to the quilt top.
4. For the outer-border, sew the  $7\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide blue floral strips together to make a long strip. Repeating step 2; measure, cut, and sew the strips to the quilt top.
5. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind the edges to finish. Add a label to the back of your quilt and enjoy!
