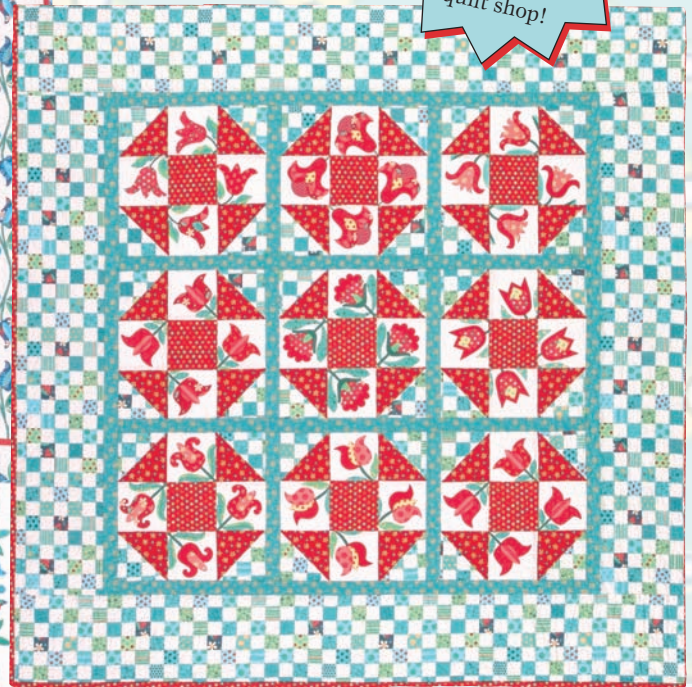

Quilt Size: 56" x 66"

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Picnic Delight

Quilt by Piece O' Cake Designs using their *Elanor's Picnic* fabric collection from P&B Textiles

Quilt Size: 56" x 66"

This quilt features running yardage of the block print with the border stripe.

Materials

EPIC 392 R or T Panel Print: 2 yards

EPIC 393 R or T Border Stripe: 1 ³/₄ yards

EPIC 399 B or R for Binding: 1 yard

Backing and sleeve: 3 ⁵/₈ yards

Cutting

EPIC 392 R or T Panel Print

Carefully cut a strip 50 ¹/₂" long from the length of the fabric. There should be 4 rows of blocks and 5 rows of checkerboard squares. Add a ¹/₄" seam allowance beyond the checkerboard squares at each end of the strip.

Trim away the selvages, leaving ¹/₄" seam allowance beyond the edges of the "sashing" that surrounds the blocks.

EPIC 393 R or T Border Stripe

Carefully cut 2 strips 8 ¹/₂" x 50 ¹/₂" long from the length of the fabric for the side borders. Add a ¹/₄" seam allowance beyond the edges of the first ¹/₂" stripe on either side of the tulip stripe area. This ¹/₄" seam allowance will come out of the checkerboard squares.

Measure the width of your quilt. Carefully cut 2 strips 8 ¹/₂" x the width of your quilt for the top and bottom borders. Add a ¹/₄" seam allowance beyond the edges of the ¹/₂" stripe on either side of the tulip/strawberry stripe area. This ¹/₄" seam allowance will come out of the checkerboard squares on one side and will be near the selvage on the other side.

Binding

Cut 1 square 30" x 30". Cut 2 ¹/₂"-wide bias strips to make approximately 260" of continuous bias binding.

Quilt Assembly

Sew the side borders to the quilt. Press seam allowances to the border.

Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt. Press seam allowances to the border.

Twirling Nine Patch

Quilt by Piece O' Cake Designs using their *Elanor's Picnic* fabric collection from P&B Textiles

Quilt Size: 47 ¹/₂" x 47 ¹/₂"

Materials

EPIC 392 T Block Print: 1 yard (3 rows of blocks totalling 9 tulip squares)

EPIC 394 T Checkerboard Print for the triangle squares and borders: 1 ¹/₂ yard

EPIC 397 R Daisy Print for triangle squares: ⁵/₈ yard

EPIC 398 R Dot for block centers and binding: 1 yard

EPIC 397 T Daisy Print for sashing: ¹/₂ yard

Backing and sleeve: 3 ¹/₈ yards

Cutting

EPIC 392 T Block Print

Cut 9 tulip blocks squares 8" x 8".

Cut each square in half horizontally and vertically making a total of 36 squares 4" x 4".

EPIC 394 T Checkerboard Print (cut lengthwise strips first)

Cut 2 strips 6 ¹/₂" x 47 ¹/₂" for the top and bottom borders.

Cut 2 strips 6 ¹/₂" x 35 ¹/₂" for the side borders.

Cut 36 squares 4" x 4" from the remaining fabric for the triangle squares.

EPIC 397 R Daisy Print for the triangle squares

Cut 4 strips 4" x 40". Subcut 36 squares 4" x 4".

Picnic Stripes

Quilt by Piece O' Cake Designs using their *Elanor's Picnic* fabric collection from P&B Textiles

Quilt Size: 51" x 64"

This quilt features running yardage of the stripe print with the checkerboard on two sides.

Materials

EPIC 393 R or T Border Stripe: 2 yards

EPIC 394 R or T Checkerboard Squares: $\frac{7}{8}$ yard

EPIC 399 B or R for Binding: $\frac{7}{8}$ yard

Backing and sleeve: 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ yards

Cutting

EPIC 393 R or T Border Stripe Fabric

Carefully cut a strip 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ " long from the length of the fabric.

On each side trim away the selvages, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance beyond the edge of the $\frac{1}{2}$ " stripe that runs down the side of the tulip/strawberry panel.

EPIC 394 R or T Checkerboard Squares Fabric

Cut 4 strips 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40". It is difficult to keep these strips absolutely straight. We decided that if they are casually off-line, that's fine. If that is going to bother you, cut these strips 6 squares wide plus a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance on each side. This should be very close to 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Piece 2 strips together to make one long strip. It will look better if you match the squares as you would pieced squares. Remember to alternate light/dark squares. Trim away the selvage and as much fabric as necessary at the end of each strip, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance beyond the edge of the squares. Make 2 long strips.

Trim each long strip to 64 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Binding

Cut 1 square 30" x 30". Cut 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide bias strips to make approximately 245" of continuous bias binding.

Quilt Assembly

Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt. Press seam allowances to the border.

Twirling Nine Patch continued...

EPIC 398 R Dot for the block centers

Cut 1 strip 4" x 40". Subcut 9 squares 4" x 4".

EPIC 397 T Daisy Print for the sashing

Cut 8 strips 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40".

Subcut 6 strips 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" for the A sashing strips.

Subcut 4 strips 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 34" for the B sashing strips.

Subcut 2 strips 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the C sashing strips.

Binding

Cut 1 square 30" x 30". Cut 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide bias strips to make approximately 202" of continuous bias binding.

Block Assembly

Place a 4" x 4" checkerboard square right sides together with a red daisy print square. Sew them together on the diagonal. Trim away the excess fabric on one side of the seam, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press the square open.

Refer to the photo and place the triangle squares, tulip squares, and block centers on your design wall in blocks.

We think it looks better if you keep matching tulips together in the same block.

For each block, sew the squares together into rows. Press seam allowances in alternate directions. Sew the rows together. Press seam allowances toward the center of the block.

Quilt Assembly

Place the blocks, sashing strips, and borders on your design wall.

Sew the blocks and sashing strips A together into rows. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing.

Sew the rows and sashing strips B together. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing.

Sew the sashing strips C to the sides of the quilt. Press the seam allowances toward the sashing.

Sew the side borders to the quilt. Press seam allowances to the border.

Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt. Press seam allowances to the border.
