YARDAGE

SAUS 485 T (large floral):	1 1/4 yards for blocks
SAUS 486 T (leaves)	1 3/8 yards for blocks and outer border
SAUS 487 X (gold circles)	1 1/8 yards for blocks
SAUS 489 T (teal stripe)	1 yard for blocks
SAUS 490 B (blue speckle)	1 7/8 yards for blocks, inner border & binding
SAUS 490 E (tan speckle)	3/4 yard for blocks
SAUS 490 X (gold speckle)	1/2 yard for blocks
BACKING	4 yards

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- All strips are cut across the width of fabric (wof).
- Use a 1/4" seam allowance throughout.
- Press seam allowances open to reduce bulk.

FLORAL SQUARES & RECTANGLES

From 485 T (large floral), cut:

- (2) 13 1/2" x wof strips;
crosscut into (8) 6 1/2" x 13 1/2" rectangles
- (2) 6 1/2" x wof strips;
crosscut into (8) 6 1/2" squares

From 490 E (tan speckle), cut:

- (1) 14 1/2" x wof strip; crosscut into
(16) 1" x 14 1/2" strips and (32) 1" x 6 1/2" strips
- (1) 7 1/2" x wof strip; crosscut into
(16) 1" x 7 1/2" strips

1. Sew 1" x 6 1/2" tan strips to the short ends of each large floral rectangle. Sew 1" x 14 1/2" tan strips to the long sides of each rectangle to complete the floral rectangle units. Make eight units.

2. Sew 1" x 6 1/2" tan strips to opposite sides of each large floral square. Sew 1" x 7 1/2" tan strips to the top and bottom edges of each square to complete the floral square units. Make eight of these units.

FLYING GEESE BLOCKS

From 487 X (gold circles), cut:

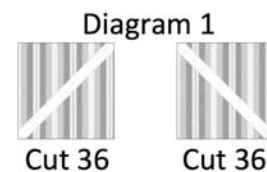
- (6) 5 7/8" x wof strips; crosscut into (36) 5 7/8" squares. Cut each square in half diagonally to yield (72) triangles.

From 490 B (blue speckle), cut:

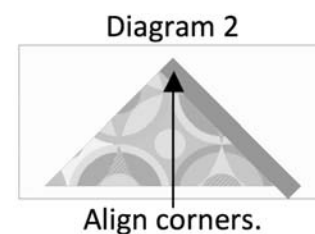
- (2) 6 1/4" x wof strips;
crosscut into (72) 7/8" x 6 1/4" strips
- (2) 5 3/4" x wof strips;
crosscut into (72) 7/8" x 5 3/4" strips

From 489 T (teal stripe), cut:

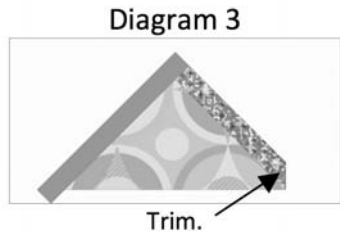
- (8) 3 7/8" x wof strips; crosscut into (72) 3 7/8" squares. Cut 36 squares in half diagonally from the upper-right corner to the lower-left corner to yield (72) triangles. Cut 36 squares in half diagonally, cutting from the upper-left corner to the lower-right corner to yield (72) triangles. Refer to diagram 1 as needed for cutting guidance.



3. Sew a 7/8" x 5 3/4" blue strip to the right edge of the triangle aligning the end of the strip with the corner of the triangle as shown in diagram 2.



4. Sew a $7/8$ " x $6 1/4$ " blue strip to the left edge of the triangle aligning the end of the strip with the corner of the unit as shown in diagram 3. Fold the unit in half and finger-press to establish a centering line on the long side of the triangle. Trim each triangle point $3 3/4$ " from the center crease. The long side of triangle should measure $7 1/2$ ".



5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 to make a total of 72 triangle units.

6. Using two teal stripe triangles with the stripe going in the same direction, sew teal stripe triangles to each triangle unit as shown in the quilt photo. Make 48 horizontal stripe units and 24 vertical stripe units. Trim the units to measure 4 " x $7 1/2$ ", as needed.

7. Using two units with the stripe going in the same direction, join the units in pairs to make 24 horizontal Flying Geese blocks and 12 vertical Flying Geese blocks. The blocks should measure $7 1/2$ " square.

CHEVRON BLOCKS

From 486 T (leaves), cut:

- (8) $4 1/2$ " x wof outer-border strips
- (4) $2 1/4$ " x wof strips

From 490 B (blue speckle), cut:

- (8) $2 1/2$ " x wof binding strips
- (7) $1 1/2$ " x wof inner-border strips
- (8) $7/8$ " x wof strips

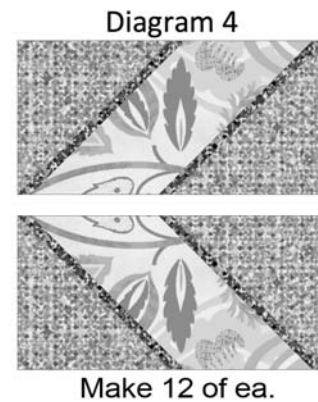
From 490 X (gold speckle), cut:

- (3) $4 1/4$ " x wof strips; crosscut into (24) $4 1/4$ " squares. Cut each square in half diagonally to yield (48) triangles.

8. Sew $7/8$ "-wide blue strips to both long sides of a $2 1/4$ "-wide leaf strip to make a strip set. Make a total of four strip sets. Cut the end of one strip set at a 45° angle. Align the 45° line on the ruler with a seam line and measure 4 " from the cut edge; then cut along the edge of the ruler to make a parallelogram. Continue in

the same manner to make a total of 12 parallelograms and 12 mirror-image parallelograms.

9. Sew a gold speckle triangle to the blue strip on each side of each parallelogram. Make 12 units and 12 mirror-image units as shown in diagram 4. Trim the units to measure 4 " x $7 1/2$ ", as needed.



10. Join one unit and one mirror-image unit to make a Chevron block as shown in the quilt photo. Make a total of 12 blocks. The blocks should measure $7 1/2$ " square.

QUILT ASSEMBLY

11. Referring to the photo, lay out the Flying Geese blocks, the Chevron blocks, the floral squares, and the floral rectangles as shown, making sure to position the Flying Geese blocks correctly. Join the pieces into rows and then join the rows to complete the quilt center.

12. For the inner border, join the $1 1/2$ "-wide blue speckle strips end to end to make a long strip. Measure the length of the quilt top through the center and cut two strips to fit that measurement. Sew the strips to opposite sides of the quilt top and press. Measure the width of the quilt top, including the just-added borders, and cut two strips to fit that measurement. Sew the strips to the top and bottom edges of the quilt top and press.

13. Repeat step 12 to sew the $4 1/2$ "-wide leaf strips to the quilt top for the outer border.

14. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the $2 1/2$ "-wide blue speckle strips, bind the edges to finish.
