Yardage ***

WHAT 360 B	map panel	1 panel
WHAT 361 W	blocks panel	1 panel
WHAT 362 B	blue city	5/8 yard
WHAT 363 T	aqua words	1/4 yard
WHAT 363 Y	yellow words	3/8 yard
WHAT 364 O	orange jacks	1/4 yard
WHAT 364 W	white jacks	3/4 yard
WHAT 365 B	blue stripe	5/8 yard
WHAT 366 B	blue tonal	1/3 yard
WHAT 366 R	red tonal	1/2 yard
BACKING	any WHAT fabric	3 5/8 yards

Cutting ***

All strips are cut across the width of fabric (wof).

From the map panel (WHAT 360 B), cut:

- (1) 40" x 22 1/2" rectangle; centering the map motif in the middle of the rectangle

From the blocks panel (WHAT 361 W), cut:

- (14) 7 1/2" squares, centering the motif in the middle of each square

From the blue city (WHAT 362 B), cut:

- (6) 3" x wof strips

From the aqua words (WHAT 363 T), cut:

- (3) 2" x wof strips

From the yellow words (WHAT 363 Y), cut:

- (5) 2" x wof strips

From the orange jacks (WHAT 364 O), cut:

- (3) 2" x wof strips

From the white jacks (WHAT 364 W), cut:

- (12) 7 1/2" squares
- (2) 7 1/2" x 9 1/2" rectangles

From the blue stripe (WHAT 365 B), cut:

- (7) 2 1/4" x wof binding strips

From the blue tonal (WHAT 366 B), cut:

- (4) 2" x wof border strips

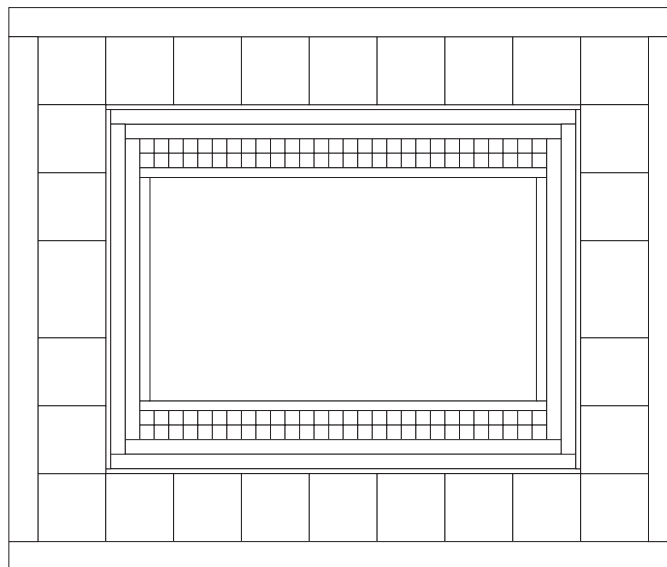
From the red tonal (WHAT 366 R), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x 42 1/2" border strips
- (2) 1 3/4" x 22 1/2" border strips
- (5) 1" x wof border strips



Assembly ***

1. Sew red 22 1/2"-long border strips to the short ends of the map rectangle. Then sew red 42 1/2"-long strips to the long sides of the map rectangle. (The borders are intentionally different widths so that subsequent borders will fit properly.) The quilt center should measure 42 1/2" x 24 1/2".
2. Sew an aqua words strip to the long side of an orange jacks strip to make a strip set. Make three strip sets and cut them into 56 segments, 2" wide.
3. Rotating every other segment from step 2, join 28 segments to make a checkerboard border strip. Repeat to make a second border strip. Sew a checkerboard strip to the top and bottom of the quilt center as shown in the photo. The quilt center should measure 42 1/2" x 30 1/2".
4. Join the blue 2"-wide strips end to end to make a long strip. From the strip, cut two 45 1/2"-long strips and two 30 1/2"-long strips. Sew the shorter strips to opposite sides of the quilt center and then sew the longer strips to the two remaining sides.
5. Join the yellow words 2"-wide strips end to end to make a long strip. From the strip, cut two 48 1/2"-long strips and two 33 1/2"-long strips. Sew the shorter strips to opposite sides of the quilt center and then sew the longer strips to the two remaining sides.
6. Join the red 1"-wide strips end to end to make a long strip. From the strip, cut two 49 1/2"-long strips and two 36 1/2"-long strips. Sew the shorter strips to opposite sides of the quilt center and then sew the longer strips to the two remaining sides. The quilt center should measure 49 1/2" x 37 1/2".
7. Referring to the photo for placement guidance, join two block squares, two white jacks squares, and one white jacks rectangle to make a border strip. Repeat to make a second border strip. Sew a border strip to opposite sides of the quilt center as shown in the photo. Make sure the blocks all face the same direction as the map!
8. Alternately join five block squares and four white jacks squares to make a border strip. Repeat to make a second border strip. Sew a border strip to the two remaining sides of the quilt center as shown in the photo. The quilt center should measure 63 1/2" x 51 1/2".
9. Join the blue city strips end to end to make a long strip. From the strip, cut two 68 1/2"-long strips and two 51 1/2"-long strips. Sew the shorter strips to opposite sides of the quilt center and then sew the longer strips to the two remaining sides to complete the outer border.
10. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Using the blue striped 2 1/4"-wide strips, bind the edges to finish.
