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Garden Steps

By Nancy Mahoney, using her *Grandma's Garden* fabric collection for P&B Textiles • Finished Quilt: 57 1/2" x 79"

Materials

(Fat Quarter measures 18" x 21")

Blocks, sashing and borders:

1 Fat Quarter *each* of all (27) *Grandma's Garden* fabrics

Cream solid for blocks, sashing corners and border corners:

7/8 yd = CSPE 01N

Pink print for binding:

5/8 yd = GGAR 793P

Backing:

4 3/4 yards of any *Grandma's Garden* fabric

Cutting

Light prints (796P, 796B, 798P, 798B, 799B) - from *each* print cut (4) 4 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles and (1) 5 1/2" x 12 3/8" rectangle.

Light prints (796C, 797T, 797B, 797P, 797R, 798G, 798C, 799P, 799T, 799C) - from *each* print cut (4) 2" x 7 1/2" rectangles, (4) 2" x 9 1/2" rectangles and (1) 5 1/2" x 12" rectangle.

Dark prints (793T, 793P, 795G, 795Y, 795B) - from *each* print cut (4) 2" x 4 1/2" rectangles, (4) 2" x 6 1/2" rectangles and (5) 2" x 10 1/2" rectangles (you'll have one extra)

Dark prints (793C, 793B, 794G, 794R, 795R) - from *each* print cut (4) 2" x 4 1/2" rectangles, (4) 2" x 6 1/2" rectangles and (5) 2" x 12 1/2" rectangles

Cream solid - cut (4) 5 1/2" squares and (10) 2" strips; crosscut into (190) 2" squares

Orange print (794O) - cut (2) 5 1/2" x 12 3/8" rectangles and (1) 5 1/2" x 12" rectangle

Yellow print (794Y) - cut (1) 5 1/2" x 12 3/8" rectangle and (1) 5 1/2" x 12" rectangle

Pink print - cut (8) 2" strips

Construction

(Refer to diagrams and photo to assemble the quilt)

1. Sew a 4 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle between two dark 2" x 6 1/2" rectangles and press toward the dark rectangle. Make 20.
2. Sew a dark 2" x 4 1/2" rectangle between two cream 2" squares and press toward the dark rectangle. Make 40.
3. Sew one unit from step 1 between two units from step 2, as shown in diagram 1. Make 20.
4. Sew one unit from step 3 between two light 2" x 9 1/2" rectangles and press toward the light rectangle.
5. Sew a light 2" x 7 1/2" rectangle between two cream 2" squares and press toward the light rectangle. Make 40.
6. Sew one unit from step 4 between two units from step 5, as shown in diagram 2, to make one block. Make 20.

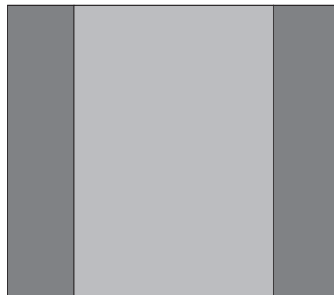

7. Arrange and sew together five dark 2" x 12 1/2" rectangles and four blocks, starting and ending with a dark rectangle. Make 5 block rows.

8. Arrange and sew together five 2" cream squares and four dark 2" x 10 1/2" rectangles, starting and ending with a cream square. Make 6 sashing rows.

9. Arrange and sew the block rows and sashing rows together as shown in the photo.

10. Sew (6) 5 1/2" x 12" rectangles together to make a border strip. Make 2 and sew to each side of the quilt top.

11. Sew (4) 5 1/2" x 12 3/8" rectangles together. Sew a 5 1/2" cream square to each end. Make 2 and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top.

12. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind the edges to finish. Add a label to the back of your quilt and enjoy!

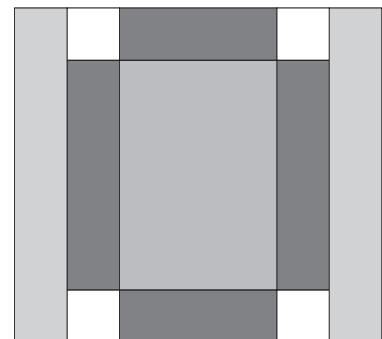

Grandma's Flowerpots

By Nancy Mahoney, using her *Grandma's Garden* fabric collection for P&B Textiles • Finished Quilt: 23" x 12"

Materials

(Fat Eighth measures 9" x 21")

1 fat eighth of cream solid CSPE 01N

1 fat eighth *each* of (2) dark prints for flowerpots and flowers

1 fat eighth *each* of (2) light-medium prints for borders

9 buttons for flower centers

1 yard of green medium rickrack for stems

$\frac{1}{2}$ yard for backing

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard for binding

27" x 16" piece of batting

Cutting

Cream solid - cut (3) $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, (3) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 21" strips;

crosscut *each* strip into

(1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle,

(2) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangles,

(2) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2" rectangles, and

(2) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " squares

Dark print for flowerpots - cut

(3) $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" rectangles,

(3) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" rectangles

Dark print for flowers - cut

(9) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " circles

Light-medium prints - from *each*

of the prints cut (1) 3" x $7\frac{1}{2}$ "

rectangle (2 total), (3) 3" x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

rectangles (6 total) and (2) 3"

squares (4 total).

Construction

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the $1\frac{1}{4}$ " cream squares. Place a marked square on each end of one $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 5" rectangle, right sides together. Stitch along the line, trim away the excess fabric, and press toward the cream.

2. Sew one unit from step one between two $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " cream rectangles and press toward the cream. Make 3.

3. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2" cream rectangles. Place a marked rectangle on each end of one $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" rectangle, right sides together. Stitch along the line, trim away the excess fabric, and press toward the cream.

4. Sew one unit from step 3 and one $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " cream rectangle together as shown in diagram 1; press toward the cream.

5. Sew one unit from step 2 and one unit from step 4 together to make one flowerpot unit. Sew a 3" x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " light-medium rectangle to the bottom of the unit. Make 3.

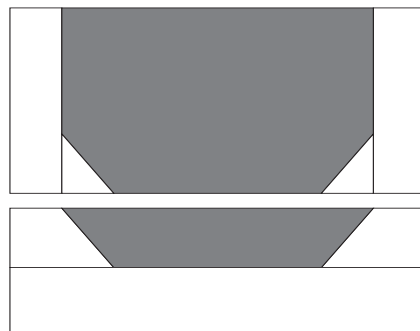

6. Sew one $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " cream rectangle and one 3" x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " light-medium rectangle together.

7. Press a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " circle in quarters to locate the center. Fold the edge to the center of the circle and press. Fold the next edge to the center; press. Continue folding and pressing to make a hexagon flower, see diagram 2. Make 9.

8. For the stems, cut the rickrack into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths. Referring to photo, to position (3) folded flowers and (3) rickrack stems in the center of one unit from step 6. Set the flowers aside and stitch the stems in place with matching thread.

9. Sew one unit from step 5 and one unit from step 8 together to make one block. Make 3. Sew the three blocks together and press.

10. Sew a 3" x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle between two 3" squares; press. Sew to opposite sides of the block unit. Attach the flowers using a button in the center.

11. Layer the quilt with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind the edges to finish. Add a label to the back of your quilt and enjoy!

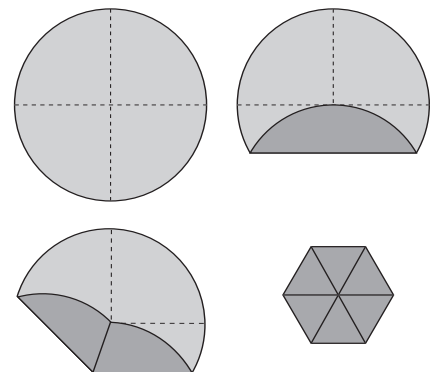
